Already Gone by Ken Ham & Britt Beemer

With an introduction from Britain, Ham & Beemer describe the dying church; 1,500 churches in England have done so...

One source (of England) describes the condition of the church as “**redundant**”; and makes the following:

Invariably, it seems, the churches become redundant. The country changes around them and for one reason or another they find themselves bereft of the worshippers needed to keep them going.
