

## **Plight of a Parent – Letters from Dad, Item #4**

In October, following my release from jail, I received the contents of the evidence pertaining to my case; a summary of the evidence was provided in the last writing, “Plight of a Parent – Aggravated Stalking”. This final letter in a series (of six letters) is specifically about “Item #4” of the evidence described as follows:

4. Selected letters from a collection that I have written to my children entitle “In a Word” [again, I have included one (1) letter as an example]

The summary (from “Plight...Aggravated Staking”) began as follows:

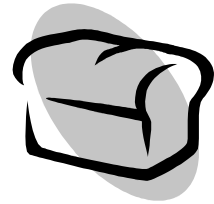
An example of item #4 is enclosed with this writing – and represents one of over 300 letters written about my children over the last five years; the collection of these letters, is called “In a Word”. Please read the letter – realizing of course that it is just a small of the collection; ask yourself this basic question: is the content suitable or normal for an alienated parent (or parent in general) to write to his child or children? Only in the perversion of the injunction can such content be construed as malicious and an assault.

It seems so innocent and commonplace for parents and their children to communicate; and by this statement, I mean in a positive, redeeming and mature (for the parent) way. How could any such action be perverted into a crime or a breach of the law? Well, the answer is a restraining order or, more recently, and injunction.

In this final letter of a series, I close with one of the many letters developed for my children over the seven years of estrangement; not that they will ever understand the truth of this matter, but that they may believe that I have – and will always – love them...as a parent is supposed to do. This particular letter, “BLESSINGS”, is just one over 300 letters written under the title of *In a Word*. There is nothing intended – nor expressed – in these hundreds of letters that is malicious or harassing; what’s more, there is nothing that I have done since the alienation of my children to warrant such claims or conditions. The whole matter – which I refer to as *The Mess* – can be attributed to the single testimony and court-related actions of my ex-wife; her testimony has been the singular evidence used by the Prosecution to profile me as potentially dangerous. In contrast, medical evidence has been ignored; though ironically, had been ordered by the courts. How can it be that the courts ignore the evidence of which they order? I don’t know or cannot reason this dilemma...but can anyone?

## BLESSINGS

What is meant by a “blessing”? The word blessing means a *divine or heavenly reward*; but it also means the opposite of a curse.



When we “say the blessing”, we are giving thanks for the food before us; as with food, all good things are from the Lord, and provide nourishment to sustain us. When someone describes themselves as blessed, it means that they have received good fortune or divine favor from the Lord.

A blessing does not always appear as a blessing; but, only later, may be realized as a blessing. In the Bible, Joseph was sold into slavery by his jealous brothers and spent many years living in Egypt separated from his family. But what may have seemed like a curse, God planned and managed as a blessing; as Joseph eventually became a very powerful leader in Egypt and was able to provide for his family when a famine struck their homeland. During the separation, he must have experienced some sorrow, pain, and even anger; yet, he remained faithful, trusting in his Lord in all matters.

God’s plan prevailed amid the mistakes and misfortunes of Joseph and his family. God is the *master planner* that knows even the number of hairs on our head. The Proverbs tell us that: even though we have our plans, God’s plan will prevail; even though we not always accept or acknowledge a blessing as a blessing, the revelation of the blessing will come to those who wait, watch, and obey.

Each of you is a blessing to me, your mother, and our families; but only God knows your *innermost being* and the blessings planned, stored, and given to you. Our response to God determines whether we are a blessing to others; this response comes with the simple truth that we deserve nothing. In his mercy and love, God has endowed eternal life to all those who acknowledge and receive him as Lord – this is the greatest blessing of all.
