Recently, I saw this word on a banner at a garage; the advertisement pertained to brakes and, of course, reminded of Matthew or "Matt" as he now goes by. But while on the term, let me explore the basic understanding as it applies to life...rather than just brakes.

With a luminous trail stretching out behind him, you might think Ocean had grown a gray beard! There's nothing on this earth quite like him, not an ounce of fear in that creature! He surveys all the high and mighty—king of the ocean, king of the deep!"

Yes, God is even more powerful than the mighty leviathan – and is king over all that are proud.

So now we know unstoppable is all these things; and while I may have left something out of this description, let me say to Matt that I am so proud of your art and everything I know of you.
